SammyRides

Sammy Rides, a project sponsored by Team Will, will take place in spring 2011. From March to May, the four-man team will ride along the southern portion of the U.S. from Phoenix, AZ to their hometown of Greater Sun City Center, FL. They will cycle 2400 miles over two months. The average age of the cyclists is 70.

The namesake of the ride is one of riders and his wife's grandchild, Sammy Rotman, who died at the age of 9 from Osteosarcoma, a bone tumor. The ride has brought together volunteers from all over Greater Sun City Center who help to raise awareness and funds to eliminate pediatric cancer. The ride honors Sammy along with all the children who are being, have been, or will be affected by pediatric cancer.

The goals of the ride include bringing awareness to the issue of pediatric cancer in this country, visiting hospitals along the route to show there is hope, bringing a message of the need for volunteering to universities along the route, demonstrating there are senior citizens who are active and want to make the world a better place for their children and grandchildren and showing there are senior citizens who are still full of life, productive, and planning for the future.

We will be featuring riders from the past years in upcoming newsletters. The first one we have talked to is John Depew, who has been on Team Will 3 times now.

1. When did you first get involved with Team Will and how did you hear about it?
I first heard of Team Will (TW) through a friend and former TW rider Van U'ren

in the summer of 2005. I started riding with Team Will shortly thereafter in

preparation for the 2006 cross country ride.

2. What was your motivation for joining and riding across the country?

Initial motivation was to do the ride. The challenge of riding across the country in a 10-day event was really appealing. We didn't know if it was actually possible. Once we got into the

3. What was a memorable experience from any of the trips?

Hands down, the hospital visits are always the most moving events on any trip. Specifically, while in Springfield, IL, in 2008, we met a 3 year old boy, Travis, who was so full of life and so much like my own boys that he was a true inspiration to all of us. I honestly believe he cheered us up more than we cheered him.

4. How did you get into shape to ride the cross-country trip?

There is no substitute for saddle time and lots of climbing to get the legs in shape. The TW ride isn't a race, but you have to keep moving. Endurance is the key, so you really have to pay attention to food and drink both on and off the bike. I had done a ride from San Francisco to Boulder, CO, in 2003, so I had an idea how to prep for this trip. As it turned out, the TW ride was much more grueling since the challenges of leapfrogging the other teams via the van and visiting hospitals and attending rallies really cut into recovery time.

5. What are you doing now and are you planning to ride the next trip in 2012? I've just begun my first term as a member of the TW Board of Directors and look forward to assisting with the planning of the 2012 ride. I've ridden in all 3 cross country events to date and plan be there again in 2012!!
